Beit Sasson today has great momentum. We have had an extraordinary year of reaching many milestones: our Membership is growing, our security infrastructure was significantly enhanced, the new Beit Midrash/Library on the second floor is in the process of being built, as well as new offices and spaces being created on the second and third floor. The creative arrangement with our sister congregation Shaarei Tefillah, where we hold daily evening services jointly continues to be strong. This is the result of a collective effort of many committees and individuals. We are indebted for their hard work and diligence:

Rabbi Oren Simhi, will start his third year as our Rabbi. We are fortunate to have him. Rabbi Simhi, *posek* extraordinaire, has been an exceptional match, and an all-time favorite with the young and not so young at *Beit Sasson*. He has been instrumental in developing programs for our children, including the Family Learning Program on Motzaei Shabbat, and the Shahrit Teen Minyan.

<u>Security infrastructure</u>: using grants from the Department of Homeland Security and CJP, we have significantly enhanced our security infrastructure. We have installed a fence around *Beit Sasson*, replaced all the exterior doors and most of the interior ones and fitted them with secure locks. We have also implemented a secure room. We are grateful to Ruthy Philosophe and Nir Maimon for their tireless efforts in managing the security infrastructure.

<u>Support for Israel</u>: after the devastating events of October 7th, the *Beit Sasson* community quickly mobilized and raised and distributed more than \$56,000.
